**7. HOME OCCUPATIONS LOCAL LAW: Review Public Hearing
Comments**

Mark Taylor, Attorney for the Town, said this Local Law amends four chapters of the Town's Code. It will provide for uniform public notice procedures to be used for public hearings conducted by the Planning Board and the Zoning Board of Appeals. It will require the following:

- Posting of notice of the public hearings to property owners within 500 feet of the application boundaries.
- The new Local Law will require the Planning Board to give notice of the submissions of an application for a site plan or sub-division approval.
- Under the Clearing and Grading Law the Planning Board is required to conduct a public hearing.
- Under the Telecommunications Facilities Wireless Chapter the Planning Board is required to conduct public hearings for the proposal of cell tower proposals.
- Under the Sub-Division Regulations the Planning Board is required to conduct public hearings.
- Under the Zoning Code the Planning Board is required to conduct public hearings for Site Plan Applications.
- The Zoning Board of Appeals will be required to conduct public hearings for variances and Special Permits.
- The Planning Board Site Plan Applications will have a mailing requirement after the first appearance of an applicant to the Planning Board. A letter will be required to be mailed to all property owners within 500 feet notifying them that the Planning Board has received the application.
- Notices of the Public Hearing date must be posted at the subject property near the front property line or on or near the street line.
- The Zoning Board will have the applicant submit first class postage paid envelopes and notices to the secretary of the Planning Board and the Zoning Board of Appeals, who will file an affidavit of mailing to the Board.

Supervisor Booth asked if the Town Board Members or the public had any questions.

Both Councilwoman Greene and Councilman Piaquadio are pleased with the 500 feet requirement.

Mr. Taylor said the Town Board has received comments on this Local Law from the Orange County Department of Planning, the Town's Planning Board and the Zoning Board of Appeals. He asked the Town Board to consider the comments submitted.

Councilman Woolsey said he will read and consider the comments submitted before making a decision.

MOTION was made at 7:14 p.m. by Councilwoman Greene to close this public hearing. The motion was seconded by Councilman Piaquadio.

DISCUSSION: Supervisor Booth said this matter will be revisited at the August 8th Audit Workshop Meeting.

8. **PUBLIC HEARING (7:15 p.m.): Local Law Amending Chapter 185 Entitled "Zoning" of the Code of the Town of Newburgh to Establish Supplementary Regulations Applications to Home Occupations**

Supervisor Booth asked Town Clerk Zarutskie if all of the proper posting and advertising have been done to conduct this public hearing.

Town Clerk Zarutskie said notice of this public hearing has been posted in the lobby of Town Hall since July 10, 2012, it was advertised in the *Sentinel* on July 10, 2012 and in the *Mid Hudson Times* on July 11, 2012.

MOTION was made at 7:16 p.m. by Councilwoman Greene to open this public hearing. The motion was seconded by Councilman Piaquadio.

Mark Taylor said this Local Law will amend the definition in the Town's Zoning Code for Home Occupations and introduce supplementary Regulation applicable to Home Occupations. It will require certain Home Occupations that are presently operating under a permit or vested rights to terminate their operation after a period of time. In 2005 the Town of Newburgh Justice Court, in a written decision, stated in order to be lawfully conducting a home occupation must be conducted within the dwelling and not outside the dwelling. The following are prohibited as home occupations in the Town of Newburgh:

- Clinics
- Hospitals
- Barber Shops
- Beauty Parlors
- Restaurants
- Animal Hospitals
- Commercial animal breeding
- Uses in residential zones which include the outdoor use, maintenance, servicing testing, cleaning, repair, loading, unloading, or storage of outdoor machinery, motor equipment or commercial vehicles
- Uses in residential zones which include outdoor work activities conducted on the property containing the dwelling
- Taxi or ambulance or yard services

Any such use which has previously received a special permit from the Zoning Board of Appeals or existed prior to prohibition in the Zoning Code shall be deemed nonconforming.

Mr. Taylor said in the Supplementary Regulations is the State's findings and purpose. This Local Law is an expansion of the definition of what is already contained within the definition of the Town's Code.

The findings are as follows:

The Town of Newburgh permits customary Home Occupations to be conducted as accessory uses in dwellings subject to special permit in each of its residential districts and in the Business District. The Town Board finds that certain occupations, which potentially could be conducted in dwellings, are detrimental to residential neighborhoods and accordingly are specifically prohibited. Additionally, the Board finds that occupations which require the use of outdoor motor equipment, machinery or vehicles which involve outdoor on-premise work activities or outdoor storage upon the property occupied by the subject dwelling are also detrimental to residential neighborhoods as a result of noise, traffic on residential streets, emissions and related impacts, and the presence of such equipment, machinery and vehicles and such outdoor work activities should not be permitted on the property located in a residential zone in conjunction with Home Occupations.

The purposes are as follows:

Home Occupations are permitted subject to special permits that certain occupations and professions have been customarily conducted within dwellings by residents without changing the character of the structure as a residence or the property occupied by the structure. A Home Occupation will change the residential character of the structure and the property it occupies, if it is not confined to the interior of the

dwelling or if the presence of non-residential employees is not limited. If an occupation which commences as a Home Occupations prospers and grows to a point where it is a business with more than one non-resident employee, then it should no longer be conducted as a Home Occupation. It is accordingly appropriate that the Zoning Board of Appeals require a condition of the granting of all Home Occupation special permits that the permit is for a finite time period and subject to application by the applicant at the stated interval for renewal following review and hearing by the Zoning Board of Appeals.

No more than one non-resident employee, associate, assistant or intern shall work on the premises at any one time. The non-resident employee's associate's assistant's or intern's work activities shall be confined to space within the dwelling. The non-resident employee, associate, assistant or intern shall not engage in outdoor work activities.

No outdoor machinery, motor equipment or commercial vehicular maintenance, service, testing, cleaning or repair, nor the loading and unloading of motor equipment in conjunction with a Home Occupation shall be conducted on the residential premises of the Home Occupation in residential zones, except inside a building on the premises.

No commercial vehicle, trailer or motor equipment parking, storage, loading or unloading in conjunction with the Home Occupation shall take place outdoors on the residential premises of the Home Occupation in residential zones, except for the parking of one vehicle as permitted pursuant to section 185-13E. Home occupations shall provide off-street parking for any and all anticipated increases in vehicles at the premises above and beyond the parking already required. Off-street parking required for the Home Occupation shall not be located in a front yard.

Delivery and pickup of material or commodities to and from the residential premises of a Home Occupation in a residential zone by a commercial vehicle shall not exceed 20 vehicle trips per week.

Mr. Taylor said the Town of Newburgh has looked at the number of businesses that involve landscaping and similar types of occupations within residential zones who have never obtained a special permit. They found that there is a significant amount of businesses operating with permits. The Code does provide for notice for these business owners who have applied for variance permits or have vested rights. They will have one year to apply to the Zoning Board of Appeals for an extension.

Supervisor Booth asked if the Board or the public had any comments or questions.

Michael O'Brien, Pressler Road, asked if the posting requirements were met regarding this public hearing. He was unable to locate the posting in the *Mid Hudson Times* this week or the Town's Web Page. Mr. O'Brien asked the Board to keep the public hearing open until the public has more input.

Town Clerk Zarutskie said he went onto the Town's Website, after he had talked to Mr. O'Brien, and Mr. O'Brien was right -- the notice of this public hearing was not in the News and Announcements sections of the Home Page, but it was listed in the minute's information section of the website. An ad regarding this public hearing was advertised in the *Sentinel* on July 10, 2012 and in the *Mid Hudson Times* on July 11, 2012. Under State Law, a notice of a public hearing on a zoning matter cannot be published less than ten days prior to the hearing. Notification of this public hearing has also been posted in the lobby of Town Hall since July 10, 2012. Mr. Zarutskie apologized for the error, but legally the Town is on firm ground because it was posted and advertised.

Mr. O'Brien asked if farming is classified as a Home Occupation.

Supervisor Booth said farming falls under Ags and Markets.

Mr. O'Brien suggested that under the new Local Law the Town consider adding the A Zone because it has more land than the Residential Areas. He asked the Town not to include the RR or the A Zone of the Town in this new Local Law.

David Sherwood, Sherwood Power Equipment, Leptondale, said he looked on the computer to find information regarding this amendment to the Local Law and was unable to find any information. He also has concerns that his business that has been in the family for 40 years may fall into this category and it would affect his business. Mr. Sherwood also has concerns for his customers if this Local Law goes into affect.

Supervisor Booth said the parcel that Sherwood Power Equipment is on was mentioned in the Comprehensive Plan. Mr. Booth said anyone who has a landscape business and does not have a Special Permit is in violation of the original Local Law.

Mr. Sherwood asked the Town Board to keep in mind that the landscapers are important to our community and to please give the density of a property consideration.

Supervisor Booth said the investment you have in your home is one of the biggest investments you have and a good neighbor does not impose on other residents.

Rob Clavin, Shelter Cove, stated that he is a plumber and asked if the amended Local Law will prohibit him from taking his truck home. Mr. Clavin said there are occasions where he is called out on an emergency and having his truck parked at home is helpful. It is his opinion that this Local Law will present a hardship for the small businesses.

Mark Taylor said the rules of off street parking commercial and recreation vehicles in all residential districts for commercial vehicles are as follows:

- They may be parked off street in residential districts provided that the vehicle engages in the division of service of delivery or pick up at the residence or the vehicle is on a private lot
- It is operated by an occupant of the principle building and the commercial vehicle is totally contained within a garage or car port.

Councilman Woolsey asked if a resident that has a truck with commercial plates that he uses personally, and he also has a commercial vehicle that is used for his business, can park both vehicles at his residence.

Mr. Taylor said a commercial vehicle is classified as a vehicle with commercial license plates that has commercial advertising and is used for a business purpose.

Supervisor Booth said the Town Board will have to look into this matter as a separate issue.

Councilman Woolsey suggested the Town Board look at the comments of the Planning and Zoning Boards before making a decision.

Supervisor Booth said it is not the Town's intent to hurt the small business owner. The Town is trying to protect the integrity of neighborhoods and the residents of the Town.

Buddy, Newburgh Animal Control and resident of the Town of Newburgh, asked if a building in a residential area can only have a 15 foot peak.

Supervisor Booth said that is correct.

Buddy said his vehicles will not fit within a 15 foot high building.

Jason Gillespie, Pressler Road, said he has a landscape business that is located at a commercial site. He asked if he would be able to bring a landscape vehicle home to mow his own lawn. It is his opinion that the Home Occupation Law needs to be rewritten from the start not added to.

Supervisor Booth said you would be considered by the Town as one of your own customers and will be able to bring your lawn mower equipment home to mow your lawn.

Supervisor Booth asked if there were any other questions. There were none.

Mr. Booth said the Board will take into consideration all of the comments made tonight before making a decision.

Councilman Piaquadio said he understands that there are a lot of small business owners who were unaware of the existing Home Occupations Local Law and that they have concerns with the amended Local Law. Mr. Piaquadio said it is apparent that these business owners have been good neighbors because their neighbors have not filed complaints against them. He said the Town is trying to improve the quality of life within neighborhoods. At some point, a business owner has to ask the question -- how many employees the business has before the business is moved to a commercial location.

Councilman Woolsey said he wants the Town Board to review the comments they have received tonight from the residents, the Zoning Board of Appeals and the Planning Board before making any decisions.

Supervisor Booth said the Board is in agreement with Councilman Woolsey.

RESOLUTION OF TOWN BOARD DETERMINING DEFAULT AND AUTHORIZING USE OF PERFORMANCE SECURITY PROCEEDS FOR COMPLETION OF PALMERONE SUBDIVISION ROAD, DRAINAGE, STORMWATER MANAGEMENT FACILITIES AND PERMANENT STABILIZATION AND RESTORATION MEASURES FOR LAND DISTURBANCE

Councilman/woman _____ presented the following resolution which was seconded by Councilman/woman _____.

WHEREAS, Hickory Shadow Inc. (the "Applicant") delivered to the Town of Newburgh M & T Bank Irrevocable Letter of Credit No. SB-910107-2000 dated April 3, 2007 in the amount of \$121,527.00 (the "Letter of Credit") as performance security for the completion of certain proposed improvements and erosion and sediment control and stormwater measures which were part of and required for the subdivision known as the "Palmerone Subdivision" on Lattintown Road, which include a proposed Town of Newburgh highway named "Dara Drive"; and

WHEREAS, M & T Bank by Notice of Non-Renewal dated February 21, 2012 notified the Town of Newburgh of its election not to renew the Letter of Credit for an additional period from the expiration date of April 2, 2012; and

WHEREAS, the Applicant had not completed the improvements and measures which the Letter of Credit secured in accordance with the standards and specifications of the Town of Newburgh; and

WHEREAS, the Town Board of the Town of Newburgh authorized a drawing under the Letter of Credit of the full amount in accordance with its terms; and

WHEREAS, the Applicant has refused or failed to undertake or complete the installation of the improvements and measures secured by the Letter of Credit; and

WHEREAS, over three years have past since the Palmerone Subdivision was approved in 2007 without the required improvements having been installed.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Town Board of the Town of Newburgh, New York does hereby find and determine that the Applicant and any successors or assigns (the "Developers") have defaulted on the obligation to the Town of Newburgh to complete the installation of the proposed improvements in the Palmerone Subdivision and related stabilization and restoration measures; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Town shall install such improvements in the Palmerone Subdivision as were covered by the Letter of Credit security and as are "commensurate with the extent of building development that has taken place in the subdivision"; and

BE IF FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Supervisor and other officers of the Town are hereby authorized and empowered to make, execute and deliver, or cause to be made, executed and delivered, in the name of and on behalf of the Town, all such drafts, certificates, documents and papers as may be necessary to effectuate and carry out the contents of the foregoing resolution; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the aforesaid resolutions shall take effect immediately .
